Cash, Visa, MasterCard, American Express, and local checks are accepted for advance sales (\$25 fee for returned checks). Cash only at the door.

PROCESSING FEE

There is a small processing fee for tickets purchased online.

PURCHASING TICKETS DAY OF SHOW

Online and festival headquarters sales close one hour before showtime. At that time, tickets must be purchased at the screening venue. (Subject to availability; **cash only** at the door.)

SOLD OUT? TICKETS AT THE DOOR.

Even if advance tickets are no longer available, tickets will be offered at the door when open seats are determined. A rush line for waiting-list tickets may start anywhere from 20 minutes to 1 hour prior to a given screening. Subject to availability; \$15 at the door (cash only).

- Ticket orders are accepted and processed on a first-come, first-served basis.
 All sales are final.
- · No refunds, exchanges or substitutions.
- · Tickets cannot be replaced if lost, stolen, forgotten, or destroyed.
- · All persons, regardless of age, must have a ticket.
- Ticket holders must arrive 20 minutes prior to showtime to be guaranteed a seat. Applies to all ticket and VIP Passholders.
- All events subject to change. On rare occasions, for reasons beyond our control, screenings must be canceled. If a screening is canceled, tickets must be returned to the Festival Headquarters the same day to exchange for another screening or for a refund.

NOTE SCREENING DATES AND TIMES. Our Mendocino Village venues are within easy walking distance of each other, but be sure to check the screening times and locations of the films you want to see. Coast Cinemas, our Fort Bragg venue, is a short 15 minute drive north of Mendocino.







Mendocino was a former mill town fallen on hard times when Bill and Jennie Zacha arrived in the 1950's. Bill acquired the Art Center grounds in 1957 with a \$50 deposit after the former Preston mansion, featured in East of Eden, burned to the ground. By 1959, with the help of many friends, artists, and townspeople, the Zacha's dream of developing an art center became reality.

During the ensuing years, the history of the Art Center and Mendocino village became closely entwined. The Art Center became the focal point of a thriving art colony which revitalized the nearly abandoned town. Today Mendocino and the Art Center are a world-renowned haven for artists in all media.
